

## Chicago/Turabian References or Bibliography Guide

### Basics of the Bibliography Page

- Chicago/Turabian has two styles for citing sources: author-date style or notes and bibliography style. Be sure to check with your teacher which one you should use.
- The References or Bibliography page should be its own page at the end of the paper.
- If you are using author-date style, title this page “References,” or if you are using notes and bibliography style, title this page “Bibliography.”
- “References” or “Bibliography” (without the quotation marks) should be centered at the top of the page.
- The list of sources should be double spaced between entries.
- Use a hanging indentation for each source. This means begin each entry with the left margin, but each subsequent line is indented by half an inch. - Alphabetize by the first term in each entry. (This is generally the author’s last name, but it could be the title of the work if there is no author)

## Author-Date Style

### Core Elements

Author. (last name, first name)

Publication date.

Title of Book. (Italics, if a book; quotations, if an article)

Title of Journal, (in italics)

Publication location: Publisher Name.

Digital location. (like Kindle, database name, the URL, DOI, etc.)

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## Examples of Book with One Author:

Austen, Jane. 2007. *Pride and Prejudice*. New York: Penguin Classics. Kindle.

Kerouac, Jack. 1958. *The Dharma Bums*. New York: Viking Press.

## Example of a Book with Multiple Authors:

Lash, Scott, and John Smith. 1974. *Dreaming of the Stars*. London: Sage Publications.
